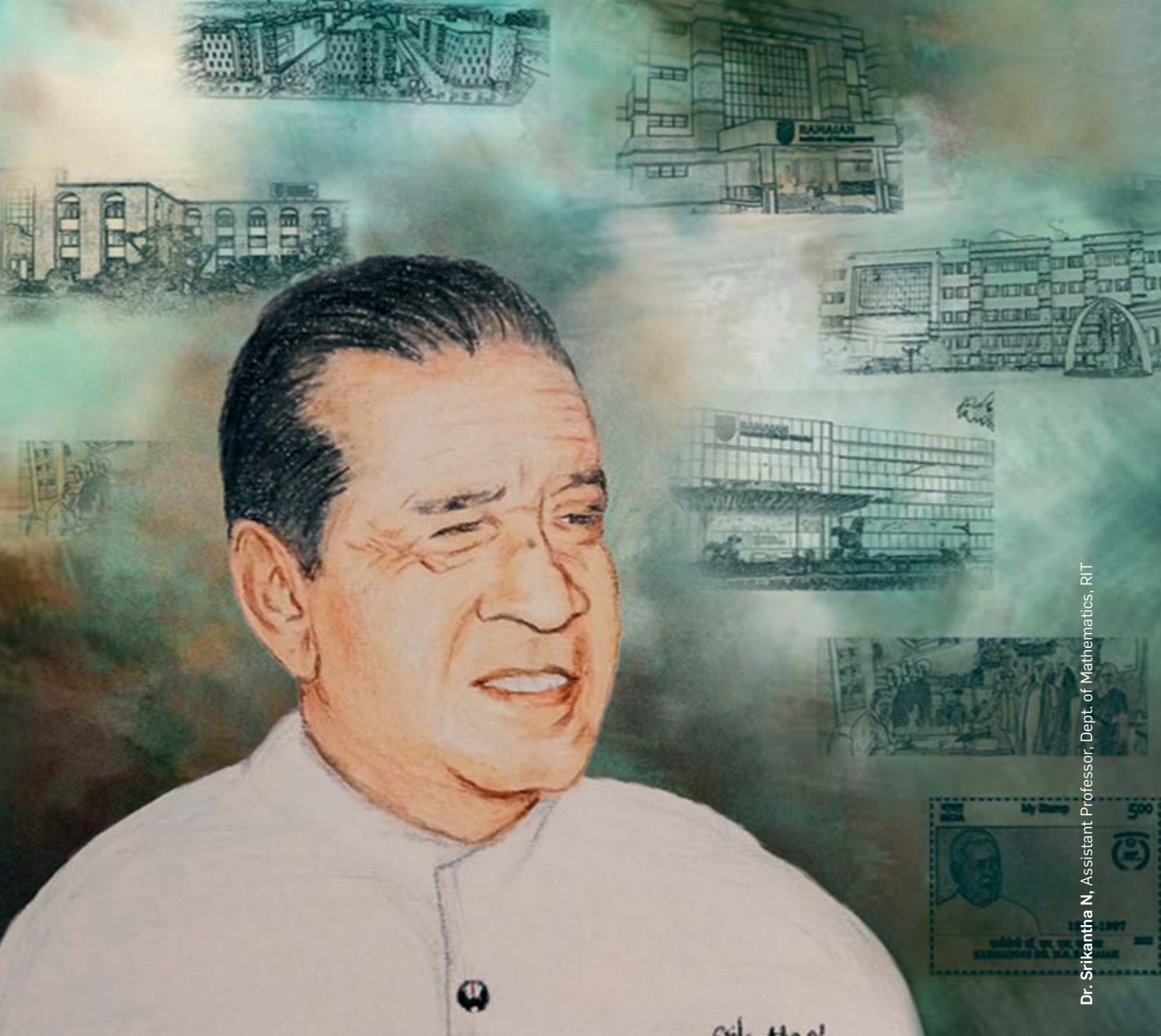

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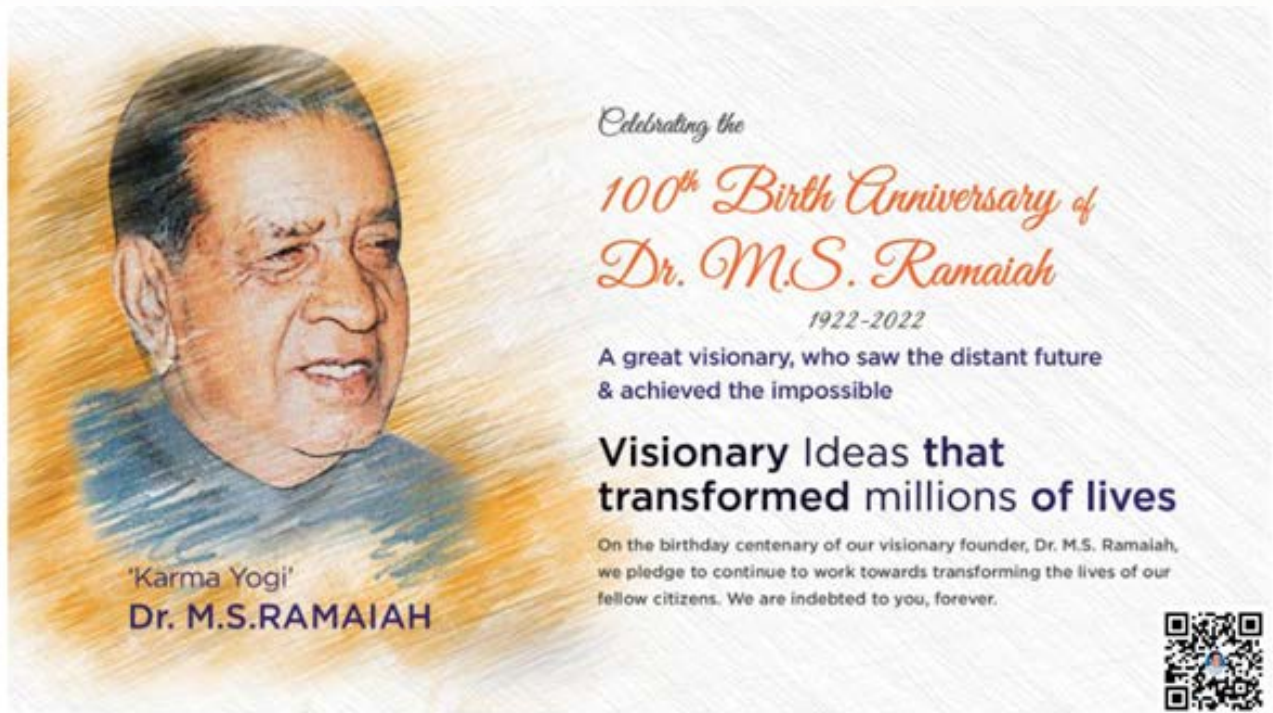
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A Tribute to Shri M. S. Ramaiah

Nostalgia with Shri. M S Ramaiah, founder chairman of MSRIT

Many thanks for giving me an opportunity to remember and pay my respects to the Founder, Dr. M.S. Ramaiah, F.I.A.E.

I was the second principal of MSRIT, after the retirement of Prof. C.R Ramachandran, an eminent

Engineer and Teacher. I never felt being a principal a burden. It was made light by the trust and confidence of the Founder and the cordial support of my colleagues, one of the best groups of teachers dedicated to their job.

However, the students who came from all parts of India and even abroad often presented difficult situations. Consequently, examinations meant great responsibility, and complex situations were managed with the full support of staff and management. The problems were

less severe when I laid down in my office, thanks to the new admission rules. My successor Prof. Krishnappa, a veteran teacher, successfully handled this problem.

MSRIT. has become one of the foremost institutions because of the mutual respect and trust between the staff and the enlightened management. The Founder did not lose much time seeing that our teaching and other staff were given the pay scales and other benefits per AICTE or Government, as the case may be.

Another unique feature was the easy loan for staff to acquire their own homes. Provisions were made for seats in the college for the children of teaching staff and other staff. Many have benefitted from this helpful scheme.

The Founder was also fully aware of the problems faced by students. He tried his best and helped me in improving the students' hostel. Extracurricular activities and sports received adequate support. The Founder would always preside over the Annual day celebrations. We had several distinguished Engineers and even Politicians participate in this function.

The Founder was most responsive to my plan to depute our teachers for higher studies. Many staff got their doctorate and master's degrees under this scheme.

The Founder would suggest the subject of interest helpful to the students and ask me to present it before

the relevant bodies of the University, such as the Senate and Syndicate.

Over the years, the Founder gave up the Governing Council chairmanship to Sri. M.R. Jayaram, who conducted the meetings successfully.

My relationship with the Founder was based on mutual understanding, and most problems were resolved after frank discussions. He was never tired of working. He was delighted that the second major project, the M.S.Ramaiah Hospital and College, had taken off and established itself as an Institution which attracted students from all over the country and abroad.

Sri. M.S.Ramaiah. had a spiritual bent of mind too. He was keenly interested in Mahabharatha. I had the pleasure of discussing our ancient writings. I was pleasantly surprised by his interest and in-depth knowledge about all this.

Sri.M.S. Ramaiah. was also responsible for improving Kaivara and laid the foundation for making it a famous pilgrimage centre.

I pray God to bless the management to continue successfully carrying on the work done by our beloved Founder.

Reminiscences with
Shri. M S Ramaiah and MSRIT

It is not the out of context if I remember how that MSRIT was started by our founder Chairman Sri MS Ramaiah. A class one contractor felt that working under engineers, why don't we produce engineers rather? This idea was incumbent for some time and hatched in 1962 as MSR College of Engineering. He made all arrangements to start a college, and with the state government's permission, MSCE came into existence.

I applied for the position of Lecturer in the Electrical department through recruitment. I started my career as a teacher on September 5th 1962. I was also fortunate to witness. The first Flag hoisting ceremony on August 15th 1962 at the MSRCE premises.

It was a one-man department of Electrical Engineering. The other department was Mechanical Engineering. Only two departments started with the guidance and an instruction of the principal Prof.C R Ramachandran. I could build a fairly good Electrical Lab and other Labs for training Electrical instruments. After C R Ramachandran I worked under disciplinarian Prof. Y A Prahalad Rao. His guidance in running the department was of great help to me. It is a great experience to set up an Electrical Lab at that

time. For a few years, all labs were functional to the requirements of the university norms. The guidance and help from the principal Prof.C R Ramachandran, and our founder chairman Dr.M S Ramaiah was a great help. I am indebted to the management for sending me to the US to acquire knowledge in the field of Electronics.

Founder Chairman Dr.M S Ramaiah was very much invested in developing all the college laboratories to be the best in the university in his direction, encouraged financially. Teachers' day is to be celebrated in the college with vigour and promptness. Use to invite all the teachers of engineering colleges in the city to the part of the function. The founder had a great respect for the teachers. He was of the opinion that happy teachers would deliver good knowledge to their students. He created a fund to give to teachers to hone their abode. This shows how our founder worried about the teacher imparting knowledge to his students.

The founder was to inspect all the works on the college premises and take suggestions from the concerned. In the year 1968, the college's name was changed from MSRCE to MSRIT. During the seventies, the growth of the institution was phenomenal. Two

departments were grown to 10 departments to cater to the needs of the society's requirements for the industry.

During the 1970s, the trouble in the students' community quelled and in the 1980's institution grew to a premier Engineering institution in the country. Now a premier engineering institution and the topping among the best engineering institutions in the country.

I am delighted to note that MSRIT is the most sought after institution and satisfied that I have little contribution to the growth of the top institution in the country.

In conversation with Dr Udayakumar.HM, Prof. Shivashankara Murthy, former Mathematics professor and Head of the Department, walks us back down memory lane. Prof.Shivashankara Murthy joined Ramaiah College of engineering in 1962, on the day of the inauguration of the institute. Shivashankara Murthy donned various roles as a Lecturer, Senior Lecturer, Head of the Department, Sports Secretary, NCC officer, Drama Coach and even as a hotel warden in his career spanning 36 years.

The former professor of Ramaiah Institute of Technology recalls, "I was a young boy of age 21 when I joined the College, and the encouragement and the appreciation of my work helped me serve the College for nearly 36 years. I passed through all the stages of being a lecturer, senior lecturer and Head of the Department".

He further recollects his fond memories with all the staff members and Shri.M S Ramaiah, the founder of the Institution. He thinks of Mr Ramaiah in great regard, as a man who was gracious enough to engage him with the Institution and was happy to be associated with him. "I was previously working in BMS College of Engineering before coming to Ramaiah College, our principal professor CR Ramachandran had good faith in me and with another senior staff member Shri.VS Ananthachar we could build a good team of staff members. From 1967 onwards, I happened to be the HOD of the Mathematics Department. During my journey in College, I had a good relationship with all the staff members of different departments", he adds.

He spoke further about his association and the memories with MS Ramaiah, prof. Shivashankara Murthy recalls the determination and generosity of the founder of this Institution and how Ramaiah utilised not just his wealth but time and efforts to build such a prominent institution which stands tall among the institutions and universities of the state as well as the country.

"Shri. Ramaiah had made good property and he thought, why not contribute to education with the wealth he had accumulated? He wanted to utilise this wealth for this purpose. He was determined to spend that money on education; he first started Engineering College,

then Medical College. He never allowed anyone to get involved in construction when he was present. He appeared very strict. We were young and afraid of him. We used to run away in the opposite direction and avoid him. He encouraged students to participate and study well", he harks back to what he can remember. He was very helpful to students and staff members and gave free seats to their children, and he harks back to what he can remember. Maybe his selfless service, dedicative nature, and tireless work are the great foundation that made the Institution at its greater height today.

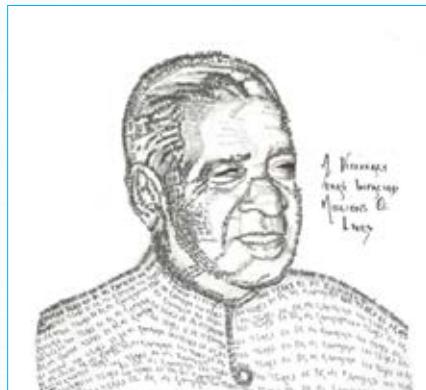

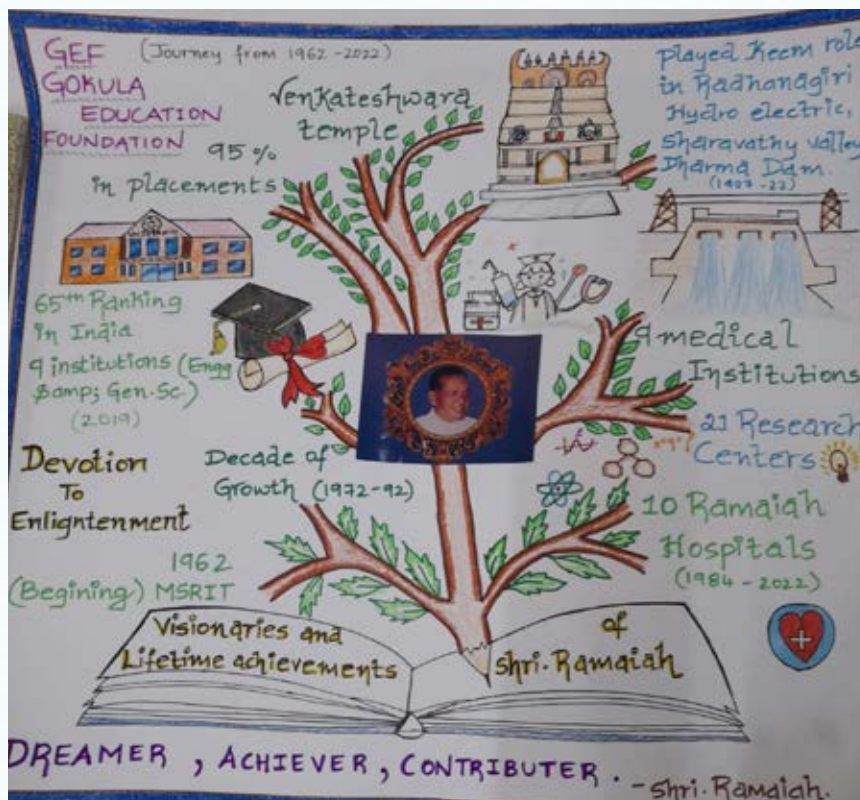
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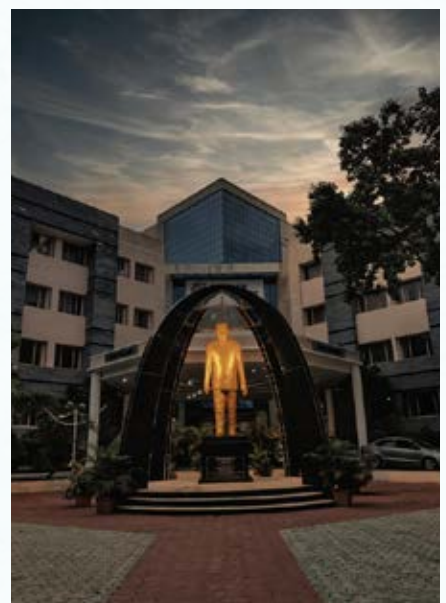

GEF (Engg & Sciences) Construction of Dome on Heritage Block

The Heritage block was designed by Honourable Founder Chairman Dr M S Ramaiah in 1970 to house the administrative offices of Engineering college and Engineering college library. In 1976 cellar, Ground floor and first floor were completed and commissioned. Founder chairman vision was to construct the building like vidhana soudha and to have dome similar to vidhana soudha.

The student strength was increased after 1978 and 2nd floor was constructed and space was allotted for construction of domes. He has started front elevation of the building by constructing wide steps along with assembly stage.

In the year 2000 after demise of Honourable Founder Chairman campus redevelopment project was started by the Honourable Management and thought was given to fulfil the dreams of Founder Chairman.

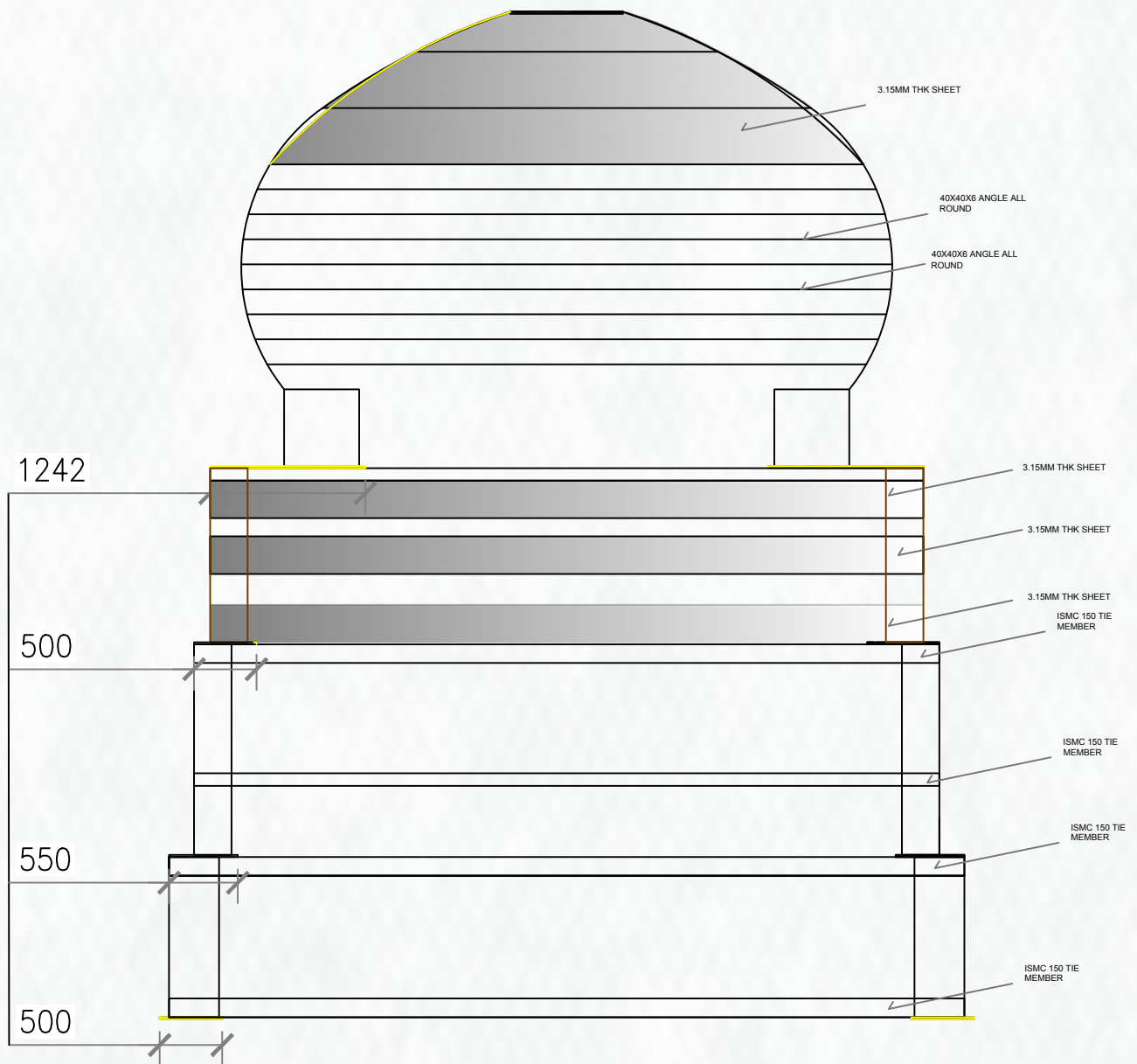
The construction of smaller domes on east and west ends of the heritage block was constructed in the year 2012. Simultaneously the front elevation of heritage block was also completed using double line dressing of stone masonry. Separate columns were also constructed to take the central dome load in the year 2012.

In the year 2020 Honourable Vice Chairman initiated the process of construction of central dome inviting designs and drawings from consultants. The construction process started in the year 2021 and completed in 2022.

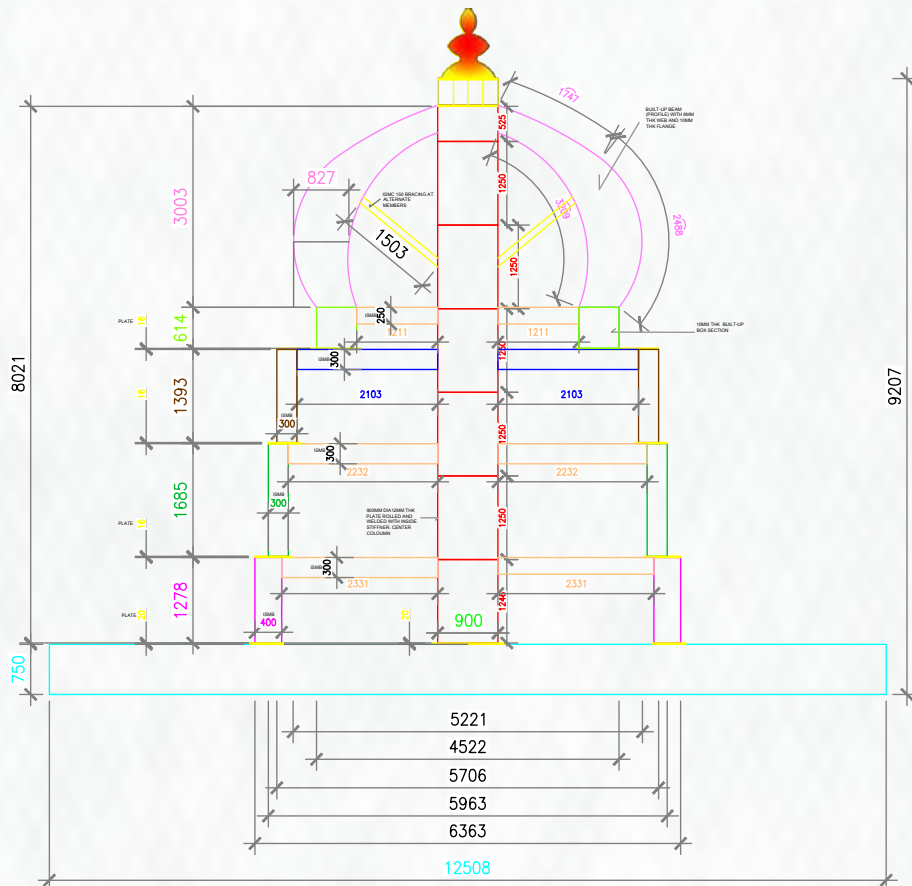
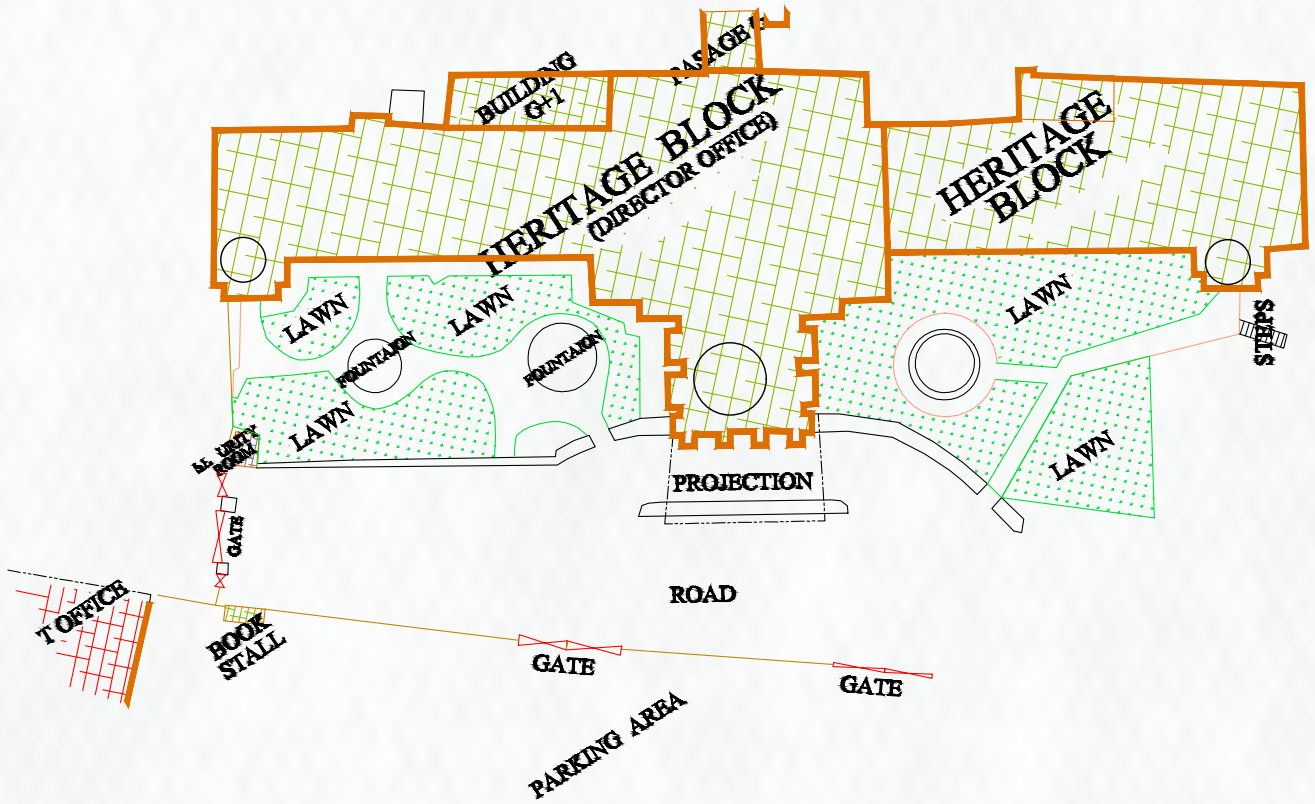
The central dome has three stages when compared to two stages of smaller domes. The height the central dome is 30 feet from the roof level of heritage block. 58 tonnes of steel components 70 tonnes of stones are used for construction. An hollow 1 m dia MS tube is placed at the centre to get spherical shape. 6½' Kalasam made up of 62 kg of brass plated with gold is

installed at the top of dome to absorb the maximum amount of spiritual energy from the space and to distribute to the students of the institution.

He was hardworking, talented, patient, calm, and always put others before him. I'm talking about the late MATHIKERE SAMPIGE RAMAIAH, also known as M.S Ramaiah. He gives me tons of motivation and inspiration. He was a person known by none at one time, but today he's known by more than lakhs of people, streets are named in his memory, he's the reason why many people have got fame, education, and sparks in their lives, etc.

He was born on 20 April 1922 in a village called Madhugiri to Sampangappa and Narasamma. He left no chance to make his parents proud. The Greek philosopher Plato once said, "Necessity is the mother of invention". Ramaiah proved that in real life. Due to a lack of funds, he couldn't complete his education. Hence he dreamt that one day he would provide education to as many as possible, as he knew how vital education played in one's life. He worked as a farmer in Indian railways and ventured into the job of a contractor or supplier of bricks in Bangalore during World War II. Everyone has a turning point in their lives, for Shri. Ramaiah, it was the construction projects that he got that were canals of the Ghataprabha project, Talakalale Dam, Dharma project, etc. He also had a passion for Journalism and made many political opinions. In 1956, he acquired the Thainadu daily, the then oldest Kannada daily in Mysore state. He not only led it to thrive but also started Gokula, a Kannada weekly and Kailasa, a monthly. These were considered model publications. People often have an uphill battle to build one small home for themselves, and here we have Ramaiah, who constructed nearly 16 institutions within his lifetime, and it wasn't even for him. I wonder how I could match such dedication to fulfilling my dreams. Every time I read about his success, I get goosebumps, giving me the confidence to do something productive with my life. If I have to write about his honours and awards, he received many doctorates from different universities. One could find his achievements on Wikipedia, but one can't see how he had made a place in people's hearts. The most outstanding achievement for a person would be being remembered in people's good books, which not everyone can acquire.

Since humans or any living creatures fall under the cycle of life and death, one being born has to die one day. With a lot of grief, it is mentioned that Ramaiah took his last breath on 25 December 1997. A renowned educationalist, philanthropist, infrastructure visionary, industrialist, and pioneer did leave the Earth years ago but is remembered and will be remembered every day for the deeds he did in his 75 years of life.

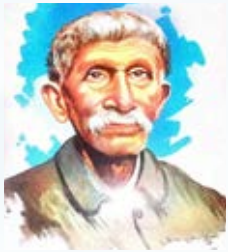

This book is about a highly principled, fearless journalist & the chief editor of "AMRUTHA BAZZAR PATRIKA", freedom fighter Motilal Ghosh who did not bow down to British.

The book starts with his early childhood & his early life as a head master who turned out to be a journalist & then into a freedom fighter through his newspapers. The book narrates about various critics against British rule & cases filed against Motilal. The book also records about the old age of Motilal who was regarded as a Lion through his newspaper.

The book witnesses the early freedom struggle of Jallianwala Bagh & Motilal views as a unconditional journalist who made a statement – "the enquiry conducted was like sprinkling water after the house was burnt". Motilal heart chanted always – "India is mine, it is my life & it is my breath". During his old age, when M.K.Gandhi met Motilal & he said – "I may die before the flag of freedom flutters Whether I am there or not, but let India get freedom as early as possible. My soul will rest in peace then". This reflects the true patriotism of a real Indian. The biography is truly inspirational as he himself is a –

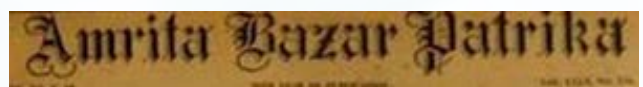
- True entrepreneur who took over news paper composing, printing & publishing without any prior knowledge.

Ashley by publishing his newspaper in English from 28th March 1978. Governor Ashley had imposed restrictions on local language newspapers.

- Authentic human who unfolded the evil plans of Lord Curzon through his newspaper who influenced students at Calcutta university.
- Faithful associate of M.K.Gandhi, Tilak, Dayanand Saraswathi & many key freedom fighters.
- Trust worthy friend of Carl Mitchell who liked the articles of Patrika & had mentioned in a letter – "you have to tell me what I have to do because you're a local man. I am with any one who tries to make life in Bengal peaceful".
- Veracious predicator who knew the real intentions of British in building hospitals, railway lines, roads, dams & canals in India.

तलवार धारदार थी।।

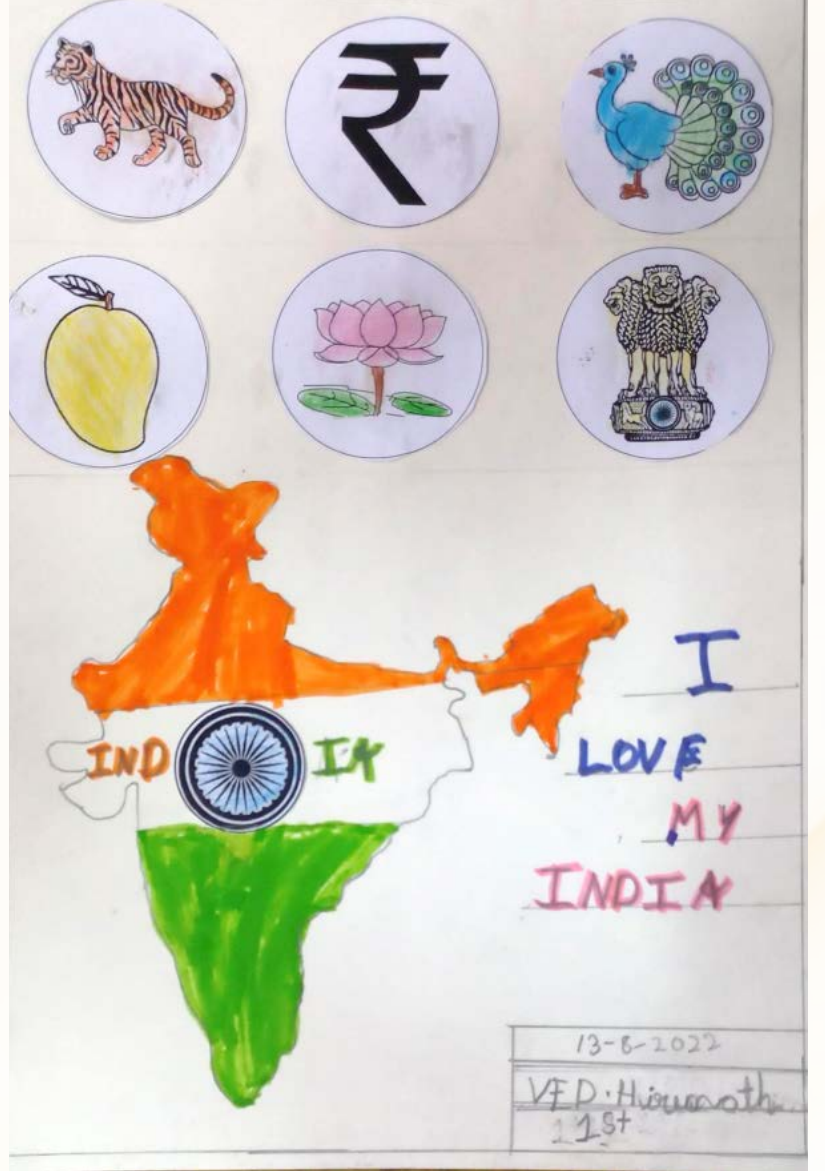

Breaking Free

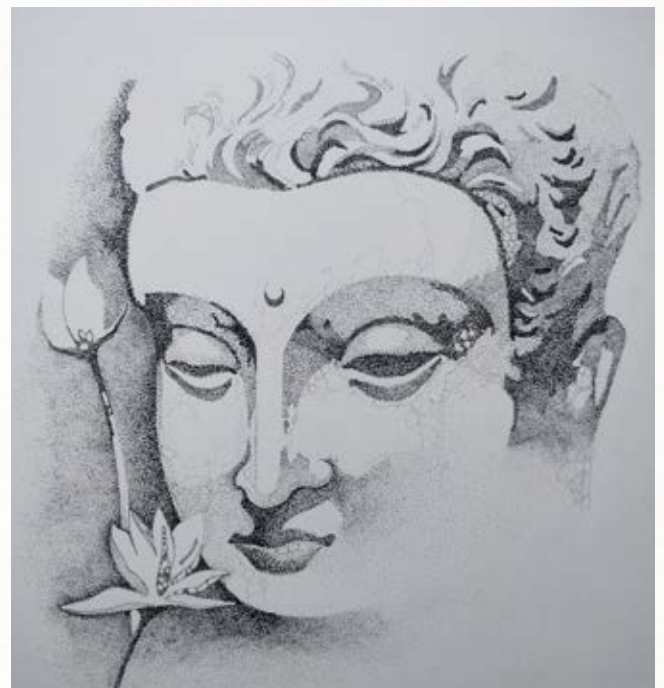

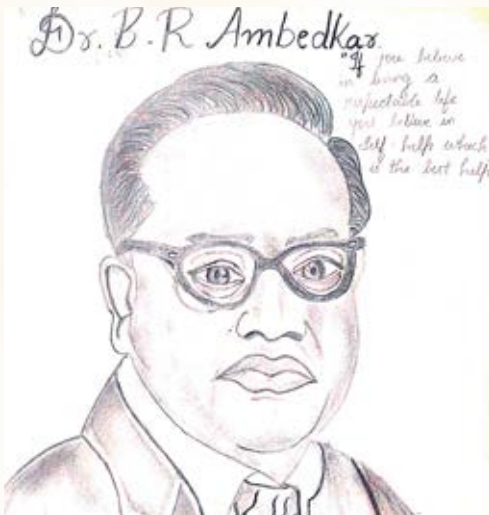
Marathon

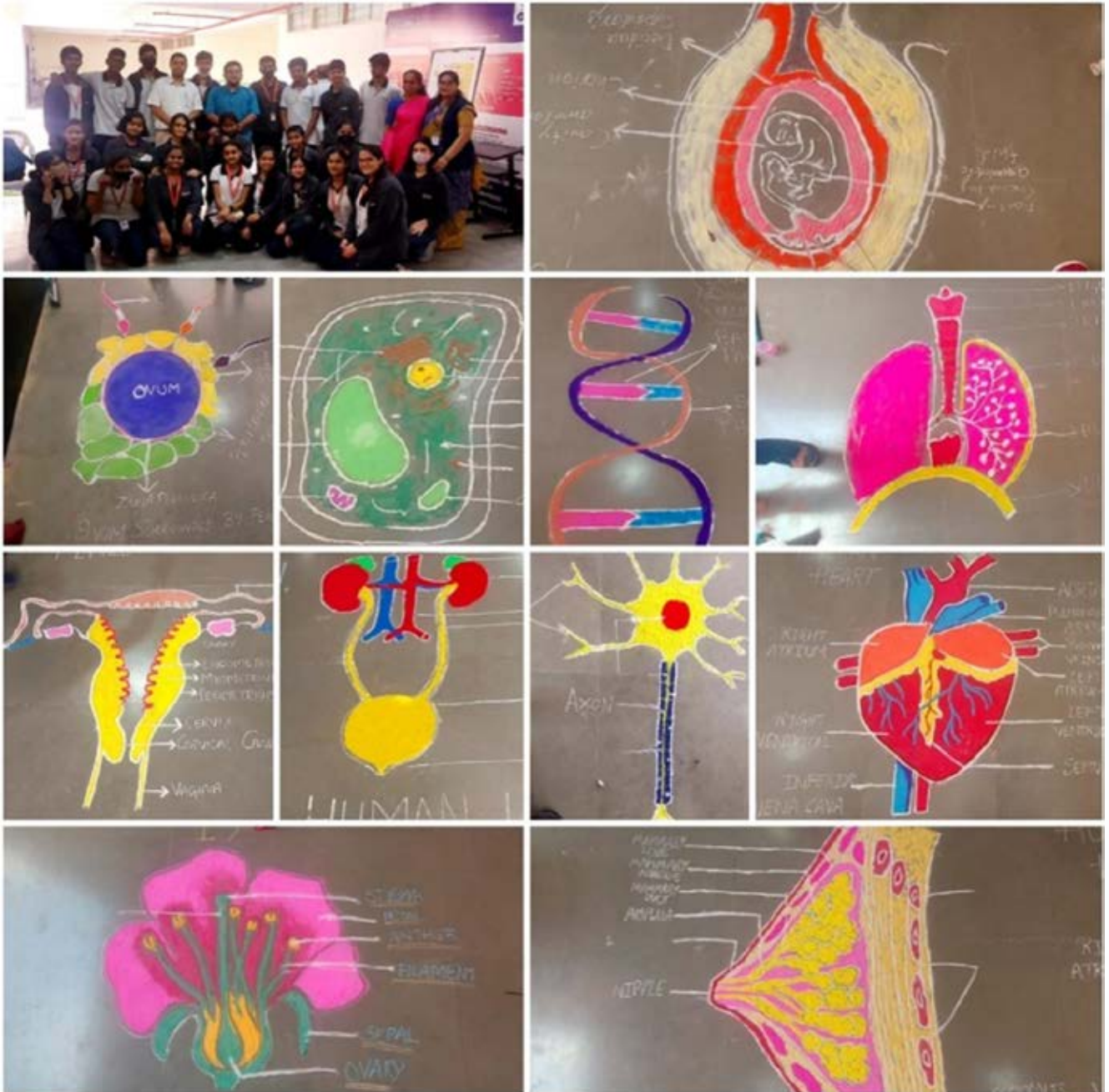

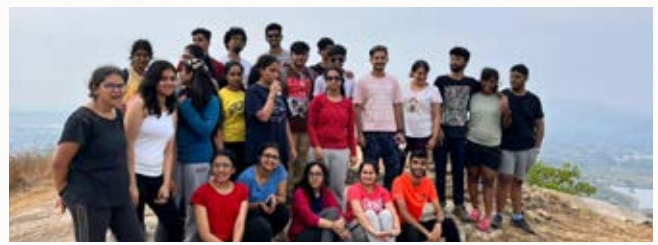
